From Principal Ziz:

Dear Canyon Park Middle School Families,

As summer comes to a close, it's time to start getting ready for school. The start of another school year is always exciting: new classes, new friends, and a new school for many of you. For our incoming sixth graders, this excitement also comes with some anxiety and a lot of questions, which is why we dedicate Wednesday, September 5, to WEB Day, giving them a chance to get familiar with the school before classes start. Details are on page 2.

All students report on Thursday, September 6, for the first day of classes. Seventh and eighth graders are encouraged to arrive a little early to pick up their class schedules in the cafeteria before school; sixth graders get their schedules on WEB Day.

The first two days of school will be six-period days to give students a chance to touch base with each class daily. The following week on September 10, we will start the block class schedule, please see our website for the block schedule.

On the bell schedule, you can see that our start time has shifted. To make bus routes work better district-wide, Canyon Park and other middle schools were changed to start at 8:20am, which is five minutes earlier than last year. Due to supervision requirements, students should arrive no earlier than 7:50am.

Please save the date of Wednesday, September 12, 7-9pm to join us for Curriculum Night. This is your chance to learn more about the school and most importantly hear about each of your students' classes directly from his/her teachers. We will send out more specifics about the event soon.

I hope you take time to review the rest of this newsletter. It contains many details about how to prepare for the start of school, how to get involved as a member of our school community, and key information about our processes and procedures. We are a growing school of over 950 students and it takes all of us working together to make this an amazing place to learn.

Due to our growing enrollment, we no longer have enough lockers for each student. Instead, we will assign lockers to 6th and 7th graders and give 8th graders the option of requesting a locker. All students (6th-8th grade) will now be allowed to carry a backpack on campus. It's a bit of a change for us but most middle schools in the region allow backpacks.

Another significant change I want to share is about Fall sports offerings. To give more athletic opportunities to 6th graders in the Fall, the soccer schedule was rearranged for all middle schools. Now, both boys and girls 6th grade soccer will be in the Fall, and both 7th/8th grade boys and girls soccer will be in the Spring.

Canyon Park Middle School is committed to providing your student a challenging, equitable, empowering, and developmentally responsive education. Along with academic growth, we believe these middle years are crucial for character and social development, so we anchor our school around the values of Excellence, Community, Responsibility, and Respect. It takes a strong partnership between the school and family to help students make the transition to middle school.

Please don't hesitate to contact us if there is anything we can do to help you support your student start of this year off on the right foot.

GENERAL SCHOOL INFORMATION

School Parking Lots: Safety First - To protect our children, please follow these safety rules:

- Do not enter the bus area between 7:50am and 3:15pm.
- All student drop-offs and pick-ups must occur either from the sidewalk or at the designated student drop-off area.
- Only CPMS staff may drive beyond the fire lane gates.
- Do not put students and adults at risk by passing other vehicles in the student drop-off area. We have had some near misses caused by impatient drivers.
- Students are not allowed on campus before **7:50am** unless accompanied by a parent—as **supervision is not available**.
- Safety must precede all other concerns. Please help keep our children safe.

Sixth grade orientation – WEB DAY! September 5

The first day of school, September 5, starting at 8:20 am, is set aside as sixth grade orientation day. In our seventh year of WEB (“Where Everyone Belongs”) program, our student WEB leaders have been trained and are ready and excited to help our sixth graders make their way around the school. We would like them to end the day feeling comfortable and confident for the school year to begin. Parents, feel free to visit our cafeteria for coffee and donuts in the morning after drop-off. Please have your student dressed in comfortable clothes and shoes, because they will be active. They will **not** need their backpacks on this day. **They may bring their lunches or purchase lunch on this day.**

School Hours

- School hours are from 8:20am to 2:55pm Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday; and 8:20am to 1:25pm on Wednesday.
- The office is open from 7:30am to 4:00pm.
- To excuse absences, call 425.408.6310 in the morning; you can leave a message if you call before/after school hours.

Odds and Ends

- The price for a **school lunch** is \$3.25 and breakfast is \$2.00 (subject to change). You may prepay with the cooks before classes start at 8am. Make checks payable to Northshore School District.
- **Bus schedule** information will be available on-line August 27th.
- We will have activity buses for sports, clubs, and detention. These buses will run on M/T/Th/F, leaving CPMS at 4:45pm.
- **Bicycles**, skateboards, roller blades, scooters or other wheeled devices cannot be ridden on campus at any time. Bicycles must be secured to bike racks located near the school's readerboard and other wheeled devices must be able to be stored in lockers.
- CPMS is a **closed campus to student visitors** during school hours all year long.
- District policy requires that all **visitors** to CPMS must first check into the Main Office before entering any campus areas.
- **Electronics/digital devices** and headphones must be turned off and stored prior to entering instructional areas, assemblies, and emergency drills and remain stored during class time (including hallways, bathrooms, etc.), unless organized and approved by a staff member for academic purposes. Confiscated equipment is released to parents only, and an Admin referral may result.
- **Student insurance** brochures will be available at orientation and in the Main Office.
- Washington state law does not permit students to carry **prescription** or **over-the-counter** medication to school. Please read the health and nursing services information sheet in this newsletter regarding distribution of medication. If your student has any life threatening diseases or allergies, please make arrangements to meet with the nurse before or on the first day of school.
- The annual **ASB Magazine and Cookie Dough Drive** that supports student activities will begin in October 3rd. Turn in dates are October 11th and October 18th and prize give away dates are October 12th and 19th. Pick up date for cookie dough is November 13th. More details to follow.

Certain guidelines are necessary and we ask that you read this carefully and review it with your student before the sale begins.

- Money collected should be turned in exactly as collected. Please do not deposit to a personal account and write a check for the total.
- Merchandise should never be left in lockers or unattended in classrooms.
- It is not necessary for a student to carry boxes of the product with him or her during the entire day. It is suggested that students pick up the product from the club advisor toward the end of the school day.
- It is recommended that the student carefully count all merchandise that is checked out to them prior to signing for the product.
- Full credit will be given to the student for any unopened merchandise returned to the club advisor.
- Either the merchandise checked out to your student, or the appropriate amount of money must be returned by the end of the sale.

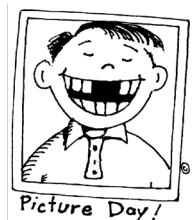
- Have a physical on file ready for the first day of turn-out. (Physicals are good for 2 years.)

ACCIDENT & HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM / STUDENT COVERAGE FOR 2018-19

The Northshore School District does not purchase insurance for coverage of student injury or accident. Parents/guardians are responsible for securing medical insurance coverage for their student and for any costs of medical treatment that may be incurred as a result of the student's athletic participation.

If you are interested in purchasing school insurance for your child, please contact the Office Manager, Tina Neil, at 425-408-6301 for details and a brochure. Meyers-Stevens & Toohey & Co. offers a wide variety of plans and coverage's including Inter-scholastic Football, 24/7 accident/illness plans, short-term plans, and dental plans at affordable rates. Coverage becomes effective at mid-night on the date the school receives the completed enrollment form and premium. You can sign up anytime during the school year.

Northshore School District – Medications and Life Threatening Policy

If your student will be taking any medication at school, you must confer with the school nurse.

The Northshore School District recommends that medication be taken at home whenever possible. We recognize, however, that in some cases it is essential that medication be administered during the school day. For the protection of all the students and to comply with Washington state law, the district has a policy and procedures in place for the handling of ALL medications in the schools.

Please do not put any kind of medicine, including aspirin, vitamins, and cough drops in your child's lunch box, backpack, or pockets. Unidentified medicine can never be given at school.

School Staff Administered - The following conditions must be met:

- ✓ All medications, whether over-the-counter or prescription, need a current Medication Authorization Form signed by the student's physician/dentist **and** parent/guardian.
- ✓ Medication must be delivered to school in a properly labeled prescription or original over-the-counter container. The student's name must be on the label with proper identification of the drug, dosage, and directions for administration.
- ✓ A quantity sufficient for one month only can be sent to school.
- ✓ The medication order is effective for the **current** school year only.
- ✓ If changes in the medication order occur, the parent is responsible for notifying the school and providing verification from the physician/dentist.
- ✓ **Field Trips:** For students on daily medication, request an extra labeled empty bottle from your pharmacy that can be used for field trips.

Student Self-Administered Medication – The following conditions must be met:

In appropriate cases and with the knowledge of the school nurse, the parent/guardian can delegate the responsibility for self-administration of medication to the student. In doing so, the parent releases the school district from any obligation to monitor the student and assumes full responsibility for the student's use of the medication.

- ✓ Self-Administration does not apply to controlled substances, e.g. codeine, vicodin.
- ✓ The student may only carry a one-day supply (1-2 doses) of the medication.
- ✓ The medication must be in the original container.
- ✓ The student must have written permission to self-medicate signed by the parent/guardian.

Medication to be self-administered for more than fifteen (15) consecutive days whether over-the-counter or prescription requires a current Northshore Medication Authorization Form signed by the student's physician/dentist and parent/guardian stating that the student may self-medicate. The student must also demonstrate his/her ability to the School Nurse to correctly evaluate his/her symptoms and use the medication appropriately.

Asthma and Anaphylaxis medications:

When a parent requests that his/her student be allowed to self-administer medication for asthma and/or anaphylaxis (severe allergic reaction), a Medication Authorization Form must be filled out and signed by the Health Care Provider **and** parent/guardian. The permission form must contain a treatment plan for what to do in case of an emergency. The Health Care provider must also provide training for the student to recognize symptoms and the correct use of medications. Additionally, the student must demonstrate his/her ability to correctly evaluate his/her symptoms and use of medications to the school nurse including how to access help when needed. (RCW 28A.210/370 and School District Policy 3419)

Children With Life-Threatening Conditions

In order to provide a safe learning environment, the state of Washington passed a law that requires students with life threatening conditions to have medical orders and a nursing care plan in place **BEFORE the first day of school attendance**. (Chapter 101, Laws of 2002, amending Chapter 28A.210 RCW). The law defines life-threatening condition as "a health condition that will put the child in danger of death during the school day if a medication or treatment order and a nursing plan are not in place." Children with life-threatening conditions such as severe bee sting or food allergies, severe asthma, severe seizures, etc., are now required to have a medication or treatment order in place before they start school.

*At the time of enrollment, complete the health information form and if your child has a life-threatening health condition requiring medical services at school, notify your school nurse. **Students with life-threatening conditions qualify for a 504 Accommodation/Emergency Care Plan. The nurse will provide with you with the necessary forms for your doctor or health care provider to complete and schedule a time to meet with you to develop a health care plan. It is advisable to get medical appointments/orders completed well before school begins.** If you have any questions or would like further clarification, you may call the district nursing supervisor at 425-408-7728 or call the nurse at your school.*

****IMPORTANT NEW VACCINE INFORMATION****

All students in 7-8 grades are required by law to get two doses of chickenpox (or varicella) vaccine. Until now, Washington State has only required students in Kindergarten through grade 6 to have two doses of the vaccine. If your student already got the vaccine or had chickenpox, then he or she will not need to get the vaccine.

- ⇒ I give permission for exchange of information between the school and HCP.
