School Parking Lots: Safety First - To protect our children, please follow these safety rules:

- Do not enter the bus area between 8:00am and 3:00pm.
- All student drop-offs and pick-ups must occur either from the sidewalk or at the designated student drop-off area.
- Only CPMS staff may drive beyond the fire lane gates.
- Do not put students and adults at risk by passing other vehicles in the student drop-off area. We have had some near misses caused by impatient drivers.
- Students are not allowed on campus before 8:00 am unless accompanied by a parent—as supervision is not available.
- Safety must precede all other concerns. Please help keep our children safe.

School Hours

- School hours are from 8:20am to 2:55pm; Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday; and 8:20am to 1:25pm on Wednesday.
- The office is open from 7:30am to 4:00pm.
- To excuse absences, call 425.408.6310 in the morning; you can leave a message if you call before/after school.

Odds and Ends

- We will have activity buses for sports, clubs, and detention. These buses will run on M/T/Th/F, leaving CPMS at 4:45pm.
- Bicycles, skateboards, roller blades, scooters or other wheeled devices cannot be ridden on campus at any time. Bicycles must be secured to bike racks located near the school's readerboard and other wheeled devices must be able to be stored in lockers.
- Backpacks, large bags, cinch bags, or any items worn on the back must be stored in lockers.
- CPMS is a closed campus to student visitors during school hours all year long.
- District policy requires that all visitors to CPMS must first check into the Main Office before entering any campus areas.
- Electronics/digital devices and headphones must be turned off and stored prior to entering instructional areas, assemblies, and emergency drills and remain stored during class time (including hallways, bathrooms, etc.), <u>unless</u> organized and approved by a staff member for academic purposes. Confiscated equipment is released to parents only, and an Admin referral may result.
- Student insurance brochures are available in the Main Office.
- Washington state law does not permit students to carry <u>prescription</u> or <u>over-the-counter</u> medication to school. Please read the health and nursing services information sheet in this newsletter regarding distribution of medication. If your student has any life threatening diseases or allergies, please make arrangements to meet with the nurse before or on the first day of s

Eligibility and How-to Information: Practice times: Typically 3:10-4:40 daily

Sport registration is online at familyid.com. Physical forms may be downloaded from the district site or picked up at Canyon Park and must be turned in prior to the start of the sports season. A CPMS ASB card is a requirement for eligibility.

- Have a physical on file ready for the first day of turn-out. (Physicals are good for 2 years.)
- Pay the junior high participation fee(s).

This will necessitate the need for students to find alternative transportation after games and matches either with a parent or in a carpool with other parents.

Screening Score Results Letter via Backpack Mail: Anticipated arrival to parents via their student's backpack is the week of January 14, 2019.

Students Who Move On to Step 2

If your student is eligible to move on to Step Two, Assessment, parent permission is required. The Screening Score Results Letter will notify you if your student is moving on to Step Two.

Please note the HiCap Department <u>must</u> receive your permission no later than 4 p.m., Friday, January 18, 2019. Instructions for giving permission will be included in the Screening Score Results Letter. If permission is not received by the deadline, a portfolio review later this spring will be conducted. There are no scheduled make-up dates for missed parent permission.

If you have not already done so, now is a great time to make sure your email contact information is up to date. Do this online through <u>ParentVue</u> or by contacting the main office at your student's school.

We appreciate your quick action in completing the permission process, should this apply to your student.
